only higher education institutions/national mobility consortium from Programme Countries holding an ECHE/Mobility Consortium Certificate for HE

can apply to the NA in their country

and administer the payments for inbound and outbound mobility!



















The number of organisations in the application form is

one - the applicant -

either a single HEI established in a Programme Country or

a national mobility consortium coordinator established in a Programme Country.

the application is submitted to the NA via E- form by

4 March at 12:00 (midday Brussels time)















Participating organisations

During the implementation of the mobility project involving Partner Countries – the minimum is one from a Programme Country and one from an eligible Partner Country.

















- all Partner Country organisations must be HEIs (accredited by the relevant national accreditation organisation) and have signed inter-institutional agreements with their Programme Country partners before the mobility takes place
- as the HEI in Partner Countries do not hold an ECHE, the interinstitutional agreements for international mobility have been adapted in order to include the main elements of the Charter
 - Cooperation based on signed inter-institutional agreements **commits Partner Countries to the principles of the ECHE** – to guarantee quality of mobility and other cooperation activities

Travel costs

Travel ranges (calculated by the Distance calculator) and corresponding amounts for travel support for staff and students:

The organisational support

OS is a contribution to any cost incurred by the institutions in relation to activities in support of student and staff mobility, **both inbound and outbound**, to comply with the ECHE and inter-institutional agreements between Programme and Partner Countries. **Eligible costs** are costs directly linked to the implementation of mobility activities (excluding participant subsistence and travel).

Financing mechanism = unit costs - amount per participant (based on the number of participants)

≤100th participant: 350 EUR> 100th participant: 200 EUR

✓ the above unit costs are to be divided between the sending and hosting institutions - the institutions will decide upon the split within their interinstitutional agreements.















Additional support for specific target groups

Disadvantaged groups from Partner Countries are students coming from poor and vulnerable socioeconomic backgrounds, and minorities.

The first selection criteria for students should be academic merit - but if there are two students with the same merit, the student from less privileged socialeconomic background should be chosen.

There will not be any top up for disadvantaged groups.

The term **special needs** has the same definition as for the intra- European mobility.

As within Europe, HEIs that have selected participants with special needs can apply for additional grant support to their NA to cover the supplementary costs for their participation in the mobility activities.

Given that applications can apply for staff mobility periods of only 5 days, or student mobility periods of up to 12 months, the numbers provided are necessarily a rough approximation!





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Budget – important notes

funds with specific objectives -> imposing restrictions to the mobility activities



- no possibility of transfer between instruments funding from an instrument is ONLY to be used to fund mobility from/with the region covered by that instrument
- possibility of 10% flexibility within the same instrument (between envelopes)















Budget restrictions and particularities

ENI budget: minimum of **90%** of the available budget must be used for **inbound** student or staff mobility from the Partner Country \rightarrow

outbound mobility from Programme to Partner Countries is limited to 10% of the total budget



DCI budget: Programme Country HEIs can receive **inbound** students and staff **without any restrictions**,

but are <u>not permitted</u> to send **outbound** Programme Country **students** at first (Bachelors) or second (Masters) cycle (\rightarrow outbound third cycle (PhD candidates) or staff are eligible to be sent to Partner Countries)



Application form - content

This application form consists of the following main sections:

- **Context:** this section asks for general information about the type of project proposal you want to submit and about the Agency that will receive, assess and select your proposal;
- Participating organisation(s): this section asks for information about the applicant organisation and – if relevant – about any other organisation involved as partner in the project;
- Description of the project: this section asks for information about all stages of the project: preparation, implementation of main activities (meaning the Mobility activities) and followup;
- Budget: in this section you will be asked to give information about the amount of the EU grant you request;
- Check List/Data Protection Notice/Declaration of Honour: in these sections, the applicant is made aware of important conditions linked to the submission of the grant request;
- Annexes: in this section, the applicant needs to attach additional documents that are mandatory for the completion of the application.
- Submission: in this section, the applicant will be able to confirm the information provided and to submit the form online.

For more information on the award criteria according to which the quality assessment of this application will be done, please refer to the Programme Guide and the Guide for Experts.















Award criteria

After having passed eligibility check – QUALITY ASSESMENT on the following criteria:

Relevance of the strategy (maximum 30 points)	The extent to which the planned mobility project is relevant to the internationalisation strategy of the higher education institutions involved (both in the Programme and in the Partner country) and the rational for choosing staff and/ or student mobility.
Quality of the cooperation arrangements (maximum 30 points)	The extent to which the applicant organisation has previous experience of similar projects with higher institutions in the partner country and the clarity of the description of responsibilities, roles and tasks between partners.
Quality of the activity design and implementation (maximum 20 points)	The completeness and quality of arrangements for the selection of participants, the support provided to them and the recognition of their mobility period (in particular in the Partner country).
Impact and dissemination (maximum 20 points)	The potential impact of the project on participants, beneficiaries, partner organisations, at local, regional and national levels and the quality of measures aimed at disseminating the results of the mobility project at faculty and institution levels, and beyond where applicable, in both the programme and partner countries.















Award criteria - threshold

To be considered for funding proposal must score at least 70 points +

score at least half of the maximum points for each award criterion (minimum 15 points for the first two criteria (RELEVANCE OF THE STRATEGY and QUALITY OF THE COOPERATION ARRANGEMENTS) and minimum 10 points for the second two criteria (QUALITY OF THE ACTIVITY DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION and IMPACT AND DISSEMINATION))



possiblity of Secondary Criteria – <u>none</u> (as chosen by the NA HR for the Call 2015)















Grant amount awarded

- The demand will probably exceed funding possibilities
- the application has to be assessed separately for each of the partner country because the application may be stronger for a country than for another
- ranking of the proposals and selection of mobility projects which to support and/or to reduce their length or number of participants

The actual grant amount awarded to HEI will depend on a number of elements:

- ✓ the number of mobility periods and months/days aplied for
- ✓ the budget allocated for the mobility Action in the respective Partner Country or Region
- \checkmark the geographical balance within a given region or sub-region
