2 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE REPUBLIC OF CROATIA

The higher education system in the Republic of Croatia is currently undergoing a comprehensive reform. Its aim is the harmonisation with the European Higher Education standards and the Bologna process, embarked upon by Croatia in 2001, when Croatia acceded to the Bologna Declaration in Prague.

The Croatian higher education system comprises six universities (the University of Zagreb, the University of Rijeka, the University of Osijek, the University of Split, the University of Zadar, the University of Dubrovnik) with some eighty faculties, art academies and schools of professional higher education; six polytechnics (Zagreb, Karlovac, Rijeka, Dubrovnik, Požega, Velika Gorica); seven independent schools of professional higher education and twelve private accredited schools of professional higher education.

The new Scientific Activity and Higher Education Act, which came into force in July 2003, establishes a mixed system which supports the professional education offered by polytechnics, independent schools of professional higher education and universities on one hand, and academic education which is conducted solely at universities on the other hand. The new Act treats private and public higher education institutions equally.

Under the new Act, university education is organised according to the system of transferable points and has three levels:

1) undergraduate courses, which typically last for three to four years and bring 180 to 240 ECTS points. Undergraduate courses provide students with training for graduate courses and the possibility of finding employment in certain specialised jobs.

Upon completion of undergraduate courses, students are awarded the academic title of *baccalaureus* or *baccalaurea*, with the indication of the profession.

2) graduate courses, which typically last for one or two years and bring 60 to 120 ECTS points.

Upon completion students are awarded the academic title of *master of science* or *master of art*.

3) postgraduate courses can be taken after completing a graduate university course – they last at least for three years, and the academic title of doctor of science (dr.sc.) or doctor of arts (dr.art.) is awarded upon completion. The university can also offer postgraduate specialist courses which last for one to two years, by which one can acquire the title of a specialist (spec.) in a certain specialist field.

Professional degree courses are offered at polytechnics and independent schools of professional higher education but also at universities. Professional degree courses last for two to three years and bring 120 to 180 ECTS points. Polytechnics and schools of professional higher education can organise a professional graduate degree course. It lasts for one to two years after which the title of specialist of a certain profession (spec.) is awarded.

Tempus is a European Community programme designed to assist the process of social and economic reform and development in the Partner Countries (CARDS, TACIS, MEDA). The Tempus programme focuses on the development of the higher education systems in these countries through their cooperation with institutions from Member States of the European Community.

The Tempus programme provides EC assistance to the transition process, more generally supported by the CARDS programme in the Western Balkans countries. Assistance includes support for institutional, legal and administrative reform through transfer of know-how and training, and contribution to a greater understanding of different cultures. The Tempus programme's complementarity with the broader transition context is assured through the overall priorities and objectives established by the **CARDS** programme and set out in the **Stabilisation and Association Agreements**.

TEMPUS provides a significant support to the reform of the higher education system in the Republic of Croatia. The main objective of the Tempus programme is to facilitate and support the integration of the Croatian HE system into the EHEA. Activities supported by the Tempus programme are in line with a high national priority for Croatia: the follow-up of the **Bologna Process** and the implementation of the Bologna principles. Moreover, the Tempus programme is used as a tool for the implementation of the new **Scientific Activity and Higher Education Act** adopted by the Croatian Parliament on July 17, 2003. The new Act is the legal framework for the overall reform of the higher education system in Croatia, its harmonisation with EU standards and the integration of universities.

The Bologna Process aims at the establishment of the **European Higher Education Area**. The European Ministers of Education pledged in June 1999 to reform the structures of their higher education systems in a convergent way, while safeguarding the fundamental values and the diversity of European higher education. The year 2010 was set as a target date for the achievement of the actions defined by the Bologna Declaration.

In order to help the CARDS countries to participate in the Bologna Process, the Tempus programme attaches great importance to all reform initiatives which aim at the achievement of the objectives of this process. The programme aims to contribute to the reform of university governance, management and finance and to the development of integrated institutions of which faculties are constituent parts. These institutions should be responsible for managing their total budget and providing the necessary human resources and central services that characterise an integrated institution.

4 TEMPUS III RESULTS

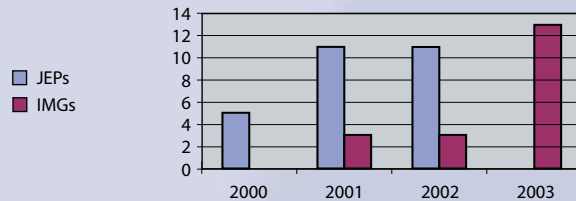
The Republic of Croatia became eligible for the Tempus programme in 2000.

The main activity within the programme is cooperation through **Joint European Projects**, which involve several HE institutions from various EU Member States and CARDS countries. Since the year 2000, 27 Joint European Projects (JEPs) in total have been approved: 5 projects in the year 2000, 11 projects in 2001, 11 projects in 2002.

Along with Joint European Projects, the Tempus programme supports **Individual Mobility Grants** for individuals in the HE sector. Since 2001, 19 Individual Mobility Grants have been awarded to applicants from Croatian HE institutions.

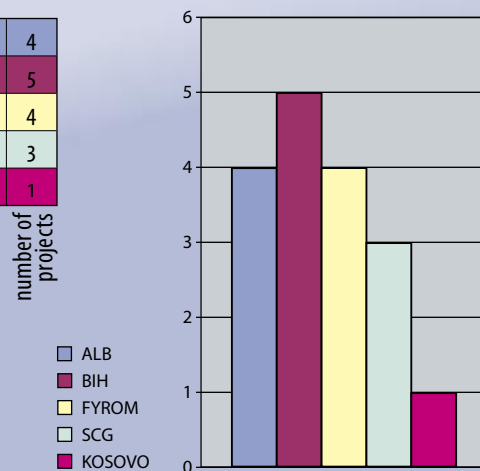

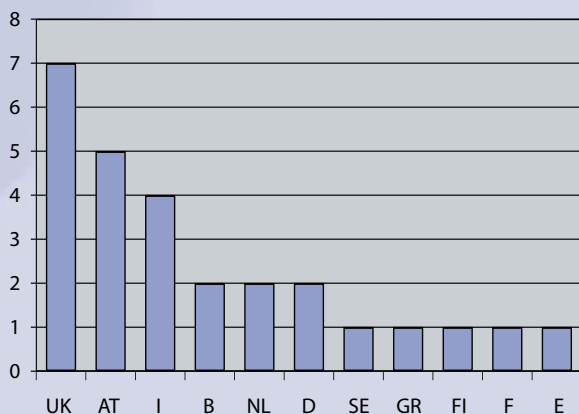

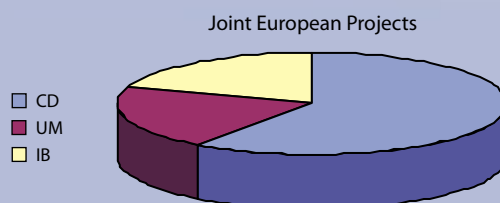

Objective:

Development of a curriculum for the MSc programme in Sustainable Energy Engineering at the University of Zagreb; introduction of credit transfer systems in postgraduate courses; introduction of new teaching methods and courses dealing with renewable energy sources, energy and environmental management and energy efficiency.

Details:

The aim of the project is to establish a postgraduate MSc programme in Sustainable Energy Engineering at the University of Zagreb, Faculty of Mechanical Engineering and Naval Architecture, following the experience of a similar programme organized at Kungliga Tekniska Hogskolan (KTH), Stockholm. An active role in lecturing is taken by professors and industry experts from partner countries as well as from EU consortium members' universities. A great assistance in preparing teaching materials and courses and in advising local teaching staff is given by two PhD students who completed a similar study programme at KTH. The programme includes a number of study visits, project work on real problems in cooperation with industry, student mobility and distance learning through on-line classrooms.

Objective:

The establishment of a new postgraduate programme as a joint project of the Faculty of Civil Engineering and the Faculty of Economics, University of Zagreb; to bring postgraduate curricula and teaching methods at the Faculty of Civil Engineering in line with highest standards in MBA in Construction.

Details:

The aim of the project is to establish a new postgraduate course "MBA in Construction". The new postgraduate course is designed for graduates from Faculties of Civil Engineering in Croatia. This programme is intended for engineers dealing with managerial jobs on construction projects, as well as for those involved in corporate management. The success of the project will serve as a basis for establishing a "Management in Construction Centre of Excellence" for civil engineers from other Central and Eastern Europe countries, in order to spread knowledge within the region. This project has two very important outcomes: a strong and direct impact on the development and upgrading of higher education in the field of construction management in this region.
